- Children's physical abilities vary with age. Describe how you would use the local environment and the characteristics of the physical environment in the extended outdoor kindergarten environment to facilitate children's exploratory play in different age groups.
- Boys and girls sometimes play different types of games. As an educator, how would you support and/or expand children's play from a gender role perspective?
- How would you use the extended outdoor kindergarten environment to facilitate good interaction between the children so that the relationships between the children are strengthened?
